Precautions are noted in this manual in order for the product to be used safely. Read this manual along with other related manuals carefully to understand the correct handling and functions of the InfoSOSA.

3-1 Warnings

Warnings for Design

Designing switches that might cause human injuries and/or property damage on the touch screen is strictly prohibited. Unintentional output signals due to malfunction of the main body, units, and/or cables, etc. can cause serious injuries. Design the system so that switches with major functions are equipped on other devices.

Obesigning safety related switches on the InfoSOSA is prohibited. Switches related to safety, such as emergency stop switches, should be made on a different hardware.

Obesign the system so the device will not malfunction due to communication abnormalities between the IS and the host controller. Failure to follow may result in injury to the human body or damage to properties.

O not use InfoSOSA as a major warning system that may cause injuries/ serious material damages, and or production stoppage. Control devices related to critical warning displays and warnings should be structured on an independent, redundant hardware system or a mechanical interlock.

NifoSOSA is not intended for use for aircraft equipment, aerospace instruments, trunk line communication equipment, nuclear power control equipment, and medical equipment that concerns life support, and or other equipment that concerns high reliability and safety. It cannot be used for these purposes.

When using the InfoSOSA for purposes that concern high reliability and safety functions and accuracy such as

transport equipment (trains, automobiles, ship, etc.), crime/disaster prevention devices, various safety devices, and medical equipment that does not concern life support, be sure to have safety features including redundancy and false operation prevention measures incorporated into the entire system.

Display will black out when the backlight goes out. If mistakenly operated in this condition, it might result in improper operation. Do not design touch-switches that might cause human injuries and material damages on the InfoSOSA.

Phenomenon as below will occur when the backlights go out:

- (1) Screen will go out even if the Backlight OFF function is not set.
- (2) Display does not recover at touch after the backlight goes off as well as the display.

Before installing the power cable, make sure power is not being supplied from power source. It may cause electrical shock.

Cautions for Disposal



When disposing the product, please treat it as industrial waste.

Precautions for Safe Use

- (1) Do not press down on display with strong power or hard objects. It may break the LCD panel and cause injuries.
- (2) Please use this product within the specified ambient temperature and humidity range. If not used properly, it may cause malfunctions.
- (3) Do not press down on the display area of InfoSOSA with sharp objects such as mechanical pencils or drivers. It may damage the display.
- (4) If the surface of InfoSOSA gets dirty, wipe with a dry, soft cloth damped with a neutral detergent then wrung dry. Do not use thinner or organic solvents.
- (5) Do not use in areas where rapid temperature change can cause condensation. It may cause malfunctions.
- (6) In order to prevent product temperature from rising, do not use in areas where heat can be trapped. Also prevent storing in areas of high temperature.
- (7) Do not use or store InfoSOSA in locations exposed to direct sunlight, fine particles, oil smoke and steam.
- (8) Do not use or store all precision equipment where shock or vibration can be applied.
- (9) Do not use or store in areas where gasified chemicals are diverged into the air, or where chemical contamination can occur.
- (10) Be sure to take backups of the data in case of an unintended accident.
- (11) When using power source with slow rise-time and fall-time, it may not operate correctly. Be sure to drop the voltage to 0V when turning the power back on after once turning off the power, before turning on the power. It may not boot correctly.
- (12) Please be warned that applications that require for one point to be pressed for a prolonged time may cause failures due to the touch screen's structural characteristics.
- (13) Touch screen coordinates may shift due to aging or depending on its operating environment. Conduct calibration of the touchscreen to correctly set the coordinates.

3-3 Handling of LCD Panels

- (1) The LCD display contains skin-irritating materials. If liquid materials flow out due to damage and comes in contact with skin, wash the area under running water for at least 15 minutes. If it gets into the eyes, wash under running water and consult a doctor.
- (2) The LCD display might have uneven brightness according to the contents being displayed. This is not a malfunction.
- (3) Minute spots (dark or bright) may occur in the LCD display elements. This is a basic characteristic of the LCD display and not a malfunction.
- (4) When LCD display is viewed outside the specified view angel, the color might seem different. This is a basic characteristic of the LCD display and not a malfunction.
- (5) When displaying a same image for a long period of time, it might cause an image lag. This is a basic characteristic of the LCD display and not a malfunction. In order to avoid image lags, change the image displayed periodically and do not display the same image for a long period of time.

3-4 Handling of Batteries

- (1) Do not recharge the batteries.
- (2) When disposing, tape the terminal and make sure it is insulated. It not insulated, it may cause heat, explosions or ignite.
- (3) Confirm the +/- polarity and make sure the it is connected in the correct direction.
- (4) Do not store in areas exposed to direct sunlight, with high temperature and/or high humidity.





7. Installation and Wiring

7-1 Installation

- Make sure that power is not applied when installing and/or wiring.
- Refer to the panel opening example and the attached outline diagrams when designing the chassis.
- Design the chassis so that there will be no contorting or deformation when installing.
- Make sure cables from the LCD do not come in contact with the structure and is not subject to stress.


7-2 Installation

7-2-1 Panel Opening Example

Below is the panel opening dimension example for when applying sheets and etc. to the surface by opening the entire touch screen surface.

Design the chassis accordingly to the actual installing method.

*Diagram from the front side of panel (panel thickness: 1.6mm or less).




7-3 Wiring Procedure

Please follow the Instructions of each number when wiring.

Apply power after all wirings are done; do not attempt to do the wiring with the power on.


All wirings do not need to be connected; connect only the ones necessary for the application to be used.

7-3-2 Connecting Unit to Power

Connecting to 5V DC Power
 Use a Power Cable to connect to 5V DC.

*GND (Signal GND) and frame (sheet metal) are connected inside the unit.

• Power Cable should be connected by shorter route than switching power.

Be sure to wire separately by sequence the input-output device, power device, and power of InfoSOSA.

 \odot Do not turn the power OFF while the unit is booting.

7-3-3 Connecting to USB Mini-B Cable

Connect to the PC's USB port and download the screen data.

When not downloading screen data, connection of USB mini-B cable is unnecessary.




7-3-4 Connecting to Communication Cable

Connect to Serial port (SIO1:RS232C, SIO2:RS422/485) of the host.

Connect to a PC if downloadscreen data.

SIO1 can be used for host communication and download screen data.

SIO2 can be used for host communication.



*Applying Ferrite Core to the communication cable is recommended for noise and static measures.



7-3-5 Connecting to Battery

Connect if battery backup of RTC is necessary.

*There are two battery interfaces. If a battery is connected to either of them, backup is possible. If you do not need to back up, you do not need to connect a battery.


• When inserting a battery, check the + and - poles to avoid incorrect insertion.

Dispose of used batteries according to law.

7-4 Mounting Conditions

- When mounting, be sure to have enough room between the unit, structure and part and also consider the operation temperature.
- Be sure that the ambient operating temperature and the ambient humidity are within their designated ranges.

(Ambient operating temperature indicates the temperature of both the display side and inside the cabinet.)

8. Starting the InfoSOSA

Make sure all the wirings are complete and turn ON the 5V DC power. A starting beep will sound. Download the screen data to the unit. For downloading instructions, please refer to the "IS731 Series Start-up Guide".

9. Starting the Development Tool (InfoSOSA Builder)

InfoSOSA will need to be installed to set and edit screens of the InfoSOSA. Once the installation is complete, and icon will appear on the desktop. Start the InfoSOSA Builder from the icon and set up or edit screens of the InfoSOSA. Please refer to the "IS731 Series Start-up Guidel" for installing, set-up, and operating procedure details.

10. Maintenance

10-1 Display Maintenance

If the surface of the display or the frame becomes dirty, wipe clean with a soft cloth dampened with thinned neutral detergent and wrung dry.

 ∞ Use of thinner, organic solvents and strong acidic solvents are prohibited.

10-2 Regular Inspections

Please conduct an inspection on a regular basis to use the InfoSOSA in its best condition.

Ambient Environment Check

- (1) Ambient temperature is within the specified range (0 to 55 degrees Celsius).
- (2) Ambient humidity is within the specified range (10 to 90%RH).
 Absolute humidity must be T=40 degrees Celsius , 90%RH or lower when T>40 degrees Celsius.

Electrical Specification Check

- (1) Voltage is within the allowance range (5VDC±5%).
- (2) Battery check

Installation Check

- (1) Make sure the connector of the connecting cable is fully inserted.
- (2) Make sure the product is securely installed and not loose.

Touchscreen Calibration Check

Conduct calibration if the coordinates of the touchscreen is not correct.
 Touchscreen calibration function needs to be set with the InfoSOSA Builder.
 Please refer to "IS731 Series Start-up Guidel" and "Reference Manual" for more information on how to setup.

11. Warranty and Repairs

11-1 Repairs

Feel free contact us if you have any questions or need to talk to someone concerning repairs of our products, but before you do, check the problems and phenomenon beforehand. Please enclose a "repair request" with the phenomenon noted when you send us the product, and be sure to take precautions when packaging the product to prevent further damage during shipment.

11-2 Warranty

The warranty period is limited to12 months (1 year) from the date of shipment. Warranty for any repair needed to the same repaired part of the same product is three months. Any defects that occur upon normal use under conditions specified herein will be repaired (factory repair) free of charge.

You will be liable for all repair fees even within the warranty period for any conditions listed below:

- (1) Any malfunctions, defects, and/or damages that occurred during transport, transfer, or mishandling by the user after delivery
- (2) Any malfunctions, defects, and/or damages caused by natural or man-made disaster.
- (3) If the product is used under any condition, in any environment, or by any method other than those specified in the specifications, catalogs, manuals, notes, and/or other documents.
- (4) Any replacement of consumables.
- (5) If the product is repaired, remodeled, modified, or disassembled by a party other than DMC.

This warranty covers only the product itself. And damages driven by the failure of our product and repairs and/or replacements done on-site will not be covered.

11-3 Production Discontinuance

In the event of production discontinuance, an announcement will be made on our guidance six months prior to the last possible order reception date.

11-4 Repair Warranty

- (1) Only products we manufacture are covered for repair warranty. This warranty is not valid for options.
- (2) Your programs and data might be lost during repairs, so please take back-ups of data beforehand. Also, note that we will not be held liable for any programs and/ or data lost during repairs.
- (3) We will take utmost care of your data stored in our product but please be sure to delete any confidential data beforehand.
- (4) Repairs will be made in our factory in principle and shipping cost will be borne by the customer.
- (5) All ownership of the repaired parts will belong to DMC.
